

Savegre Mountain Lodge Checklist and nearby sites in the San Gerardo de Dota region of the Talamanca mountains, 6,500-11,000 ft.

LOCATION CODE

- [S] Widespread over much of Savegre area, generally combines "L" and "F"
- [L] Lodge area, secondary growth, disturbed forest, roadsides, and waterways
- [F] Undisturbed primary Oak forest zone above lodge
- [P] Paramo zone 9,000-11,000 ft, includes bamboo zone and Towers Road

ABUNDANCE CODE

- 1 = Should be seen daily, generally a hard species to miss.
- 2 = Should be seen on most days of a visit to that particular habitat.
- 3 = Somewhat less common, but should still be seen. Requires some effort.
- 4 = Species is uncommon or of erratic occurrence. Generally tricky to find.
- 5 = Species is rare, seen annually, but few records per year. You'll need some luck!
- 6 = One or two records only, not to be expected. Confirmation needed.
- h = Heard considerably more often than seen.

- n = Migrants from North America, mainly present Sept through May.
- s = Migrants from South America, mainly present March through Sept.
- t = Transient migrants, mainly present from March through May and Sept through Nov.

** = Chiriqui Highland Endemic – only found in the Chiriqui Highlands of Costa Rica and Western Panama.
